accompanied by an Affidavit in Support of a Request for Execution Against Income/Property

completed by the judgment creditor.

Requests that are submitted without a CIV-SC 33 form should be returned to the marshal

or sheriff with a notation that they should be resubmitted with an Affidavit in Support of a

Request for Execution Against Income/Property.
