### INTRODUCTION BY HON. JUDY HARRIS KLUGER

New York State leads the nation in the number of operational drug treatment courts and in their expansion and institutionalization into daily court operations. The first drug treatment courts opened in New York State in the 1990's.

Recognizing their positive impact on communities and the criminal justice system, New York State's Chief Judge Judith Kaye convened an independent commission to examine the impact of drug cases on New York State courts and to make recommendations for future reforms. Following the recommendation of the Commission to make drug treatment courts available in every jurisdiction, in October 2000, Chief Judge Kaye created the Office of Court Drug Treatment Programs (OCDTP).

Over the last eight years, the OCDTP has worked alongside judges, court staff and community stakeholders statewide to expand the benefits and reach of drug treatment courts. The OCDTP staff has helped planning teams in 61 counties to plan and implement these courts in accordance with nationally recognized standards. This report presents a snapshot of the cumulative results of these activities as of December 31, 2007.

In 2007, the OCDTP focused on providing materials to the drug treatment courts to assist them in building strong and effective programs and to ensure a consistent level of service to the communities across the state served by these courts. We look forward in 2008 to the publication and dissemination of recommended practices for the adult criminal courts.

None of the work outlined in this Report would have been possible without the judges, UCS court staff, district attorneys, defense bar, local law enforcement, probation departments, departments of social services, treatment providers and other service agencies who have dedicated their time and effort to make their drug treatment courts work. I thank them for their participation in our statewide drug treatment court program and look forward to continuing our work together.

## **ABSTRACT**

---

This Report provides information about the activities of New York State Office of Court Drug Treatment Programs (OCDTP) and presents a snapshot of the cumulative results of the work of the drug treatment courts operating in New York State at the end of 2007.

On December 31, 2007, there were 171 drug treatment courts in operation: 91 in the criminal courts; 54 in the family courts; 8 in the town and village courts; and 18 focused on juveniles and young adults in either the family or criminal courts. Another 25 planning teams were working to open additional drug treatment courts in the coming year. As of December 31, 2007, over 7,380 individuals were actively participating in drug treatment court programs and the total number of individuals who had successfully graduated from these courts had grown to 17,043.

This Report describes the roles and responsibilities of the OCDTP and the training initiatives that serve to ensure consistency and quality within the drug treatment courts. The Report also presents in text, graphic and chart form, information concerning the adult criminal, family and juvenile drug treatment courts, including New York State maps that indicate which counties are receiving the benefits of one or more adult criminal, family or juvenile treatment courts. Information about the drug court participants including their age, race, gender, drug of choice and the type of offense that brought them into contact with the criminal justice system and/or family court and to the attention of one of our drug treatment courts is presented by court type. Where applicable, information regarding post-screening acceptance rates and identified reasons for applicant ineligibility is also included. The Report ends with a list of the operational drug treatment courts in New York State, organized by judicial district, along with court-specific information such as the name of the presiding judge and the cumulative number of graduates and active participants for each court as of December 31, 2007.

This Report is intended to be produced and disseminated to the drug treatment courts as a source of information on an annual basis.

## **NEW YORK STATE RECEIVES NATIONAL LEADERSHIP AWARD**

---

The New York State Unified Court System was awarded a National Leadership Award by the National Association of Drug Court Professionals (NADCP) at its 13th Annual Training Conference in Washington, D.C. in June 2007. New York State was recognized for its successful statewide effort in taking drug treatment courts to scale.

NADCP Chief Executive Officer, C. West Huddleston, III presented the award to the Hon. Judy Harris Kluger on behalf of Chief Judge Judith S. Kaye and stated, "New York was the first state to achieve this, and we are seeing efforts in other states to follow suit."

Also recognized for their leadership were the Hon. Thomas Amodeo, on behalf of the New York Association of Drug Treatment Court Professionals and Mr. Greg Berman, on behalf of the Center for Court Innovation.

## **OFFICE OF COURT DRUG TREATMENT PROGRAMS**

---

Under the direction of the Deputy Chief Administrative Judge for Court Operations and Planning, this office is responsible for the statewide implementation, expansion and support of drug treatment courts. The Office of Court Drug Treatment Programs (OCDTP) works with the District Administrative Judge's Office in each Judicial District to provide support and ongoing assistance to New York's drug treatment courts. The OCDTP also works with offices within the Unified Court System (UCS) to provide drug courts with coordination and operational assistance. Some of the OCDTP's roles and responsibilities are:

### **Leadership**

The OCDTP operates under the umbrella of the Office of Court Administration (OCA) and works to implement the Chief Judge's goals. To this extent, the Office establishes and maintains relationships with state and national agencies and associations involved with treatment courts; participates in a number of projects with other state agencies, including drug court research; and provides technical assistance on issues related to drug treatment courts.

### **Operations**

The OCDTP has regional project managers who respond to requests for technical assistance and work with each District Office to implement and support the operations of each treatment court. Collaboratively, the Offices identify preferred practices and innovative procedures and develop and implement statewide treatment court policies and procedures. The District Office may contact the OCDTP to discuss and problem-solve issues concerning the operation of their drug treatment courts.

### **Human Resources**

Drug Treatment Courts are supported by Unified Court System staff, including case managers and coordinators. The OCDTP participates on interview panels for available positions in the drug treatment courts; makes recommendations on Requests for Reclassification; participates in the development of Personnel Title Standards; and makes recommendations on appropriate work volume by title.

### **Fiscal**

The UCS Budget Office handles all financial matters for the court system. The OCDTP submits budget proposals to the Budget Office to support statewide drug treatment court initiatives, such as trainings, new courts and requests for new positions.

### **Technology**

The use of technology is a critical component in New York's treatment courts. New York utilizes a statewide management information system called the Universal Treatment Application (UTA). Among many other uses, the data received is used to provide national statistics and assist in research. The OCDTP provides training for UTA users and incorporates user feedback to develop enhancements and modifications to meet state and local needs. The Office also establishes and maintains the Problem-Solving Courts Section of the UCS Intranet website and participates in the development of new computer programs and applications.

### **Training**

The OCDTP recognizes that ongoing training is important to the development and operation of treatment courts. The Office works with the Center for Court Innovation and national training experts to conduct statewide training sessions for new UCS employees and non-UCS team members and for entire drug court teams. The Office also works with individual courts to develop and implement forums to speak to the community about treatment courts and, upon request, conducts special on-site trainings on a variety of topics.

## **OFFICE OF COURT DRUG TREATMENT PROGRAMS 2007 TRAINING INITIATIVES**

---

This fundamental two-day training program is intended for team members who have recently joined established drug treatment court teams in the adult criminal treatment courts, family treatment courts and juvenile treatment courts. Some of the functional roles included in this training are judge, district attorney, treatment provider, public defender, law guardian, resource coordinator, chief clerk, probation officer, child protective worker, police officer and court officer.

The topics presented include the Key Components and Guiding Principles of Drug Treatment Courts, Psychopharmacology of Addiction, Treatment Modalities and Cultural Competence, Team Building, Drug Testing, Confidentiality and Ethics, Sanctions and Incentives and additional breakout sessions by role to address specific operational issues.

This training session is typically offered biannually. One session is intended for the new upstate courts and the other is for the new courts within New York City, Long Island and 9<sup>th</sup> Judicial District.

### **Transitional Team Training**

This full team training session is intended for established drug treatment court teams that have experienced significant team member turnover. The emphasis in the training is roles required for all court team members. Each session trains about seven teams comprised of 8-10 members each. This training session is typically offered once or twice per year.

### **Facilitator Training**

Facilitators play an important role in the success of many of the training programs conducted by the Office of Court Drug Treatment Programs each year. These dedicated facilitators are experienced drug treatment practitioners who share their expertise with drug treatment court team members as part of the training process. This new training program was developed in 2007 in conjunction with the Center for Court Innovation and is intended to annually train approximately 30 facilitators. This will ensure that a sufficient pool of trained facilitators is available to work with each new training session.

### **ADULT CRIMINAL DRUG TREATMENT COURTS**

Adult Criminal Drug Treatment Courts operate statewide in the Supreme Courts, County Courts, City Courts, District Courts, New York City Criminal Courts and in a limited number of Town and Village Courts. As of December 31, 2007, there were 91 operational adult criminal drug treatment courts throughout the state.

Defendants facing felony or misdemeanor charges where drug addiction is a component of their offense may be eligible to participate in an adult criminal drug treatment court program. Those who successfully complete their drug treatment court program may have their charges dismissed or reduced or may receive a reduction in their sentence. The goal is to have Adult Criminal Drug Treatment Courts in every county in New York State.

The map on the next page highlights those counties within which at least one adult criminal drug treatment court was either operational or in planning.

### FAMILY DRUG TREATMENT COURTS

As of December 31, 2007 Family Drug Treatment Courts were operational in 54 counties statewide and in the planning phase in four of the remaining eight counties.

Family Drug Treatment Courts target respondents in neglect petitions where substance abuse is a component of the allegations. Respondents who successfully complete the program are reunited with their children in the great majority of cases. Additionally, successful participants in the family drug treatment court program often receive more liberal contact with their children prior to their graduation.

The goal is to have Family Drug Treatment Courts operational in every county in New York State. The map on the next page shows those counties where a family drug treatment court was either operational or in planning.

### **JUVENILE DRUG TREATMENT COURTS**

As of December 31, 2007 over 225 juveniles were being served in 13 juvenile drug treatment courts throughout the state. In addition, 10 courts were in the planning phase. The locations of these courts are indicated on the map below. Not shown are the locations of four young adult drug treatment courts which are operational in the criminal courts (target the 16 to 21 year old population).


Participants in the juvenile drug treatment courts are facing either Juvenile Delinquency or Person In Need of Supervision (PINS) petitions in the family court where substance abuse forms some component of the pending petition. Successful participation in the juvenile drug treatment court program generally results in the dismissal of the pending petition.

Juvenile treatment courts are considered to be in a developmental phase as different models are currently being studied and evaluated for effectiveness in jurisdictions around the country.



The following section provides statistical information regarding defendants or respondents who were screened for a drug treatment court program in 2007 and thereafter became participants. It includes a breakdown of the participants' drug of choice, top arrest charge, percentage of eligibility, reasons for ineligibility, age, gender and race. This data is presented for drug courts statewide, courts within NYC, outside NYC and by judicial district for the Criminal and Family Treatment Courts. Juvenile Treatment Court information is presented in a modified format.

The raw data used to create these charts was obtained from the Universal Treatment Application (UTA), an electronic management information system database updated and maintained by staff in each of our drug treatment courts.

### 2007 Total Active Participants

The total number of active participants in New York State Drug Courts fluctuates each month based on a number of factors including the number of graduates, the number of cases screened for participation and the number of cases determined to be eligible. During 2007, the average number of active participants per month was 7,568.



### Drug of Choice

The top five reported drugs were marijuana, alcohol, crack cocaine, heroin and cocaine powder. While methamphetamine use was not a significant factor in our drug treatment courts in 2007, information on methamphetamines is included as this drug has had a significant impact on other states nationwide.


Approximately 15 non-specified drugs were reported as the primary drug of choice by these individuals and this information has been included in the graph below in the "Other" category.

Statewide - Drug of Choice**







Statewide - Top Arrest Charge**





### Screening Eligibility: Criminal Treatment Courts

Potential drug treatment court participants are screened to determine if they conform to the requirements of the local drug treatment court program. This includes both a preliminary drug screen, to determine if they have a substance abuse problem and, a legal screen, to determine if their offense falls within the range of charges the drug treatment court was designed to address.


**Defendants Screened for Drug Treatment Court in 2007  
Statewide - Eligibility**





### Defendants Screened for Drug Treatment Court in 2007 Outside NYC - Eligibility






**Defendants Screened for Drug Treatment Court in 2007 and Determined to be Ineligible Statewide - Reasons for Ineligibility**








**Defendants Screened for Drug Treatment Court in 2007 Who Became Participants  
Statewide - Age**








**Defendants Screened for Drug Treatment Court in 2007 Who Became Participants  
Statewide - Gender**









Statewide - Race**






**Respondents Screened for Family Treatment Court in 2007 Who Became Participants  
Statewide - Drug of Choice**














**Respondents Screened for Family Treatment Court in 2007  
Statewide - Reasons for Ineligibility**








**Respondents Screened for Family Treatment Court in 2007 Who Became Participants  
Statewide - Age**







Statewide - Gender**









Statewide - Race**











Statewide - Reasons for Ineligibility**




