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INTRODUCTION BY HON. JUDY HARRIS KLUGER



In 2008, the Office of Court Drug Treatment Programs (OCDTP) provided local training on various topics and conducted statewide site visit operational reviews. On a statewide level, the OCDTP hosted three two-day drug court training programs for new team members, disseminated the recommended best practices for the criminal drug treatment courts and began the development of effective practices for family treatment courts.

This annual report provides information about the activities of the OCDTP and presents a snapshot of the cumulative statistical information of the operational drug treatment courts in New York State at the end of 2008. It describes the roles and responsibilities of the OCDTP and the training programs that serve to ensure consistency and quality within the drug treatment courts. This report also presents in text, graphic and chart form, information concerning the criminal, family and juvenile drug treatment courts, including New York State maps that indicate which counties are receiving the benefits of drug treatment courts. Information about the drug court participants including their age, ethnicity, gender, drug of choice and the type of offense that brought them into contact with the criminal justice system and/or family court and to the attention of one of our drug treatment courts is presented by court type. Where applicable, information regarding post-screening acceptance rates and identified reasons for applicant ineligibility is also included. The report ends with a list of the operational drug treatment courts in New York State, organized by judicial district, along with court-specific information such as the name of the presiding judge and the cumulative number of graduates and active participants for each court as of December 31, 2008.

On December 31, 2008, New York State had 170 operational drug treatment courts: 54 family drug treatment courts, 90 criminal drug treatment courts, 17 juvenile drug treatment courts and 9 town and village drug treatment courts. Another 15 planning teams were working to open additional treatment courts in the coming year. As of December 31, 2008, over 7,100 individuals were actively participating in drug treatment court programs and the total number of individuals who had successfully graduated from these courts had grown to over 20,000.

None of the work outlined in this report would have been possible without the support and dedication of our judges, UCS court staff, district attorneys, defense bar, local law enforcement, probation departments, departments of social services, treatment and prevention providers and the multitude of service agencies who work with our courts. They each focus on

the success of every drug court participant. I sincerely thank each and every one of them for their participation in our drug treatment court programs and look forward to continuing our work together.

OFFICE OF COURT DRUG TREATMENT PROGRAMS

Drug treatment courts opened in New York State in the 1990's. Recognizing their positive impact on communities and the criminal justice system, former Chief Judge Judith Kaye convened an independent commission to examine the impact of drug cases on New York State courts and to make recommendations for future reforms. Following the recommendation of the Commission to make drug treatment courts available in every jurisdiction, in October 2000, the Office of Court Drug Treatment Programs (OCDTP) was created.

Under the direction of the Deputy Chief Administrative Judge for Court Operations and Planning, this office is responsible for the statewide implementation, expansion and support of drug treatment courts. The OCDTP works with the District and County Administrative Judge's Office in each Judicial District to provide support and ongoing assistance to New York's drug treatment courts. The OCDTP also works with offices within the Unified Court System (UCS) to provide drug treatment courts with coordination and operational assistance. Some of the OCDTP's roles and responsibilities are:

Leadership

The OCDTP operates under the umbrella of the Office of Court Administration (OCA) and works to implement the Chief Judge's goals. To this extent, the Office establishes and maintains relationships with state and national agencies and associations involved with treatment courts; participates in a number of projects with other state agencies, including drug court research; and provides technical assistance on issues related to drug treatment courts.

Operations

The OCDTP has regional project managers who respond to requests for technical assistance and work with each District Office to implement and support the operation of each treatment court. Collaboratively, the Offices identify preferred practices and innovative procedures and develop and implement statewide treatment court policies and procedures. The District Offices may contact the OCDTP to discuss and problem-solve issues concerning the operation of their drug treatment courts.

Human Resources

Drug treatment courts are supported by UCS staff, including case managers and coordinators. The OCDTP participates on interview panels for available positions in the drug treatment courts; makes recommendations on Requests for Reclassification; participates in the development of Personnel

Title Standards; and makes recommendations on appropriate work volume by title.

Fiscal

The UCS Budget Office handles all financial matters for the court system. The OCDTP submits budget proposals to the Budget Office to support statewide drug treatment court initiatives, such as training programs, new courts and requests for new positions.

Technology

The use of technology is a critical component in New York's treatment courts. New York utilizes a statewide management information system called the Universal Treatment Application (UTA). Among many other uses, the data received is used to provide national statistics and assist in research. The OCDTP provides training for UTA users and incorporates user feedback to develop enhancements and modifications to meet state and local needs. The Office also establishes and maintains the Problem-Solving Courts Section of the UCS Intranet website and participates in the development of new computer programs and applications.

Training

The OCDTP recognizes that ongoing training is important to the development and operation of treatment courts. The Office works with the Center for Court Innovation and national training experts to conduct statewide training sessions for new UCS employees and non-UCS team members and for entire drug court teams. The Office also works with individual courts to develop and implement forums to speak to the community about treatment courts and, upon request, conducts special on-site training on a variety of topics.

Drug Court New Team Member Training

This fundamental two-day training program is intended for team members who have recently joined established drug treatment court teams in the criminal treatment courts, family treatment courts and juvenile treatment courts. Some of the functional roles included in this training are judge, district attorney, treatment provider, public defender, attorney for the child, resource coordinator, chief clerk, probation officer, child protective worker, law enforcement and court officer.

The topics presented include the Key Components and Guiding Principles of Drug Treatment Courts, Psychopharmacology of Addiction, Treatment Modalities and Cultural Competence, Team Building, Drug Testing, Confidentiality and Ethics, Sanctions and Incentives and breakout sessions by role to address specific operational issues.

In 2008, the OCDTP delivered three training sessions for new team members; two of these programs were held at the NYS Judicial Institute in White Plains and the third in Buffalo.

Family Treatment Court Roundtable

The Family Treatment Court Roundtable was developed to provide a facilitated discussion about the underutilization of these courts. The roundtable was attended by approximately 20 key decision makers from around the state including family treatment court judges, court attorneys, child protective services, respondent attorneys and county attorneys. The roundtable took place in Syracuse, New York and audience members spent a full day identifying the barriers to participation in the family treatment courts and brainstorming solutions. The report from the roundtable was disseminated as a resource and guide for family treatment courts around the state.

CRIMINAL DRUG TREATMENT COURTS

Criminal drug treatment courts (DTC) operate statewide in the Supreme Courts, County Courts, City Courts, District Courts, New York City Criminal Courts and in a limited number of Town and Village Courts. As of December 31, 2008, there were 90 operational criminal DTCs throughout the state and 7 in the planning phase.

Defendants facing felony or misdemeanor charges where drug addiction is a component of their offense may be eligible to participate in a criminal DTC program. Those who successfully complete their drug treatment court program may have their charges dismissed or reduced or may receive a reduction in their sentence. The goal is to have a criminal DTC in every county in New York State.

FAMILY DRUG TREATMENT COURTS

Family drug treatment courts (FDTC) target respondents in neglect petitions where substance abuse is a component of the allegations. Respondents who successfully complete the program are reunited with their children in the great majority of cases. Additionally, successful participants in the FDTC program often receive more liberal contact with their children prior to their graduation.

As of December 31, 2008, there were 54 operational FDTCs throughout the state. The map below highlights in green counties where an FDTC is operational.





JUVENILE DRUG TREATMENT COURTS

Participants in the juvenile drug treatment courts (JDTC) are facing either Juvenile Delinquency (JD) or Person In Need of Supervision (PINS) petitions in the family court where substance abuse forms some component of the pending petition. Successful participation in the juvenile drug treatment court program generally results in the dismissal of the pending petition.

As of December 31, 2008, over 1,400 juveniles participated in 17 JDTCs throughout the state. In addition, seven courts were in the planning phase. The locations of the operational courts are highlighted in green on the map below.


Juvenile DTCs are considered to be in a developmental phase as different models are currently being studied and evaluated for effectiveness in jurisdictions around the country.

New York State Drug Treatment Courts serve thousands of participants each year. The total number of active participants fluctuates each month based on a number of factors including the number of graduates, the number of cases screened for participation and the number of cases determined to be eligible. During 2008, the average number of active participants per month was 7,101.

2008 Active Participants**




The 2008 statistical information contained in the charts to follow was obtained from the Universal Treatment Application (UTA), an electronic management information system database updated and maintained by staff in each of our drug treatment courts. The data includes a breakdown of the participants' drug of choice, top arrest charge, percentage of eligibility, reasons for ineligibility, age, gender and ethnicity. For the criminal and family DTC, these statistics are presented in three categories: statewide, courts within New York City and courts outside of New York City. The statistics for JDTC which only exist outside of New York City are presented in a modified format.



Statewide – Drug of Choice**







Statewide - Top Arrest Charge**





Screening Eligibility

Potential drug treatment court participants are screened to determine if they conform to the requirements of the local drug treatment court program. This includes both a preliminary drug screen to determine if they have a substance abuse problem and a legal screen to determine if their offense falls within the range of charges the drug treatment court was designed to address.



Statewide – Screening Eligibility**













Statewide - Age**













Statewide - Ethnicity**






Approximately 15 non-specified drugs were also reported as the primary drug of choice by individuals screened for participation in the family drug treatment courts. This information is included in the "Other" category.

Statewide – Drug of Choice**







Statewide – Screening Eligibility**




















**Respondents Screened for FDTC in 2008 Who Became Participants





Statewide - Ethnicity**





Information presented on the juvenile drug treatment court program is different than the information presented in the criminal and family court programs. This is because there are far fewer juvenile drug treatment courts (JDTC) as compared to the criminal and family treatment courts. Moreover, there are no juvenile drug treatment courts in New York City; therefore, information is not broken out between courts inside and outside New York City.



Statewide – Petition Type**







Statewide - Age**



Statewide - Gender**




**Juveniles Screened for JDTC in 2008 Who Became Participants


