## Renewing Books is Easy

**Q. Which Appellate Division Law Library books can be renewed?**

A. All circulating books, except Records and Briefs, can be renewed.

**Q. How many times can a book be renewed?**

A. A book can be renewed twice, unless it has been requested by another patron.

**Q. Do I need to bring the books into the library to renew?**

A. Books can be renewed by calling the library circulation desk at 530-3250.

**Q. Can I still renew books if they are overdue?**

A. Yes, overdue books can be renewed. However, any accrued fines must still be paid.



## United States Supreme Court on the Internet

The Supreme Court of the United States unveiled its official Web site on April 17, 2000. It is comprehensive, easy to use and geared towards both attorneys and the general public. Information contained at this site ([www.supremecourtus.gov](http://www.supremecourtus.gov)) includes:

- General information about the court including court rules and biographies of current members of the Supreme Court.
- Slip opinions which are posted on the Web site within hours after the bench opinions are issued. They remain posted until opinions are published in a preliminary print of the United States Reports.
- The court schedule, court calendar, argument calendars, day call, and hearing lists.
- Argument transcripts, which will be permanently archived at this site. The full text of the transcripts are posted 10-15 days after the date of the oral argument.



During the 2000 Presidential election, the public was kept well informed at this site. Documents were posted quickly, usually within hours of being filed with the Court. To see all relevant materials, start at the home page, click on **Opinions** then click on **Latest Slip Opinions** and follow the link to **Florida Election Cases**. Included are the motions, appendixes, briefs, orders, oral arguments, and opinions.
