MOTION/CASE IS RESPECTFULLY REFERRED TO JUSTICE FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

This is a special proceeding seeking corporate dissolution. Pursuant to Paragraph B of the *Guidelines for Assignment of Cases to the Commercial Division*, this matter was assigned at random among the Justices of the court generally. Justice Lottie E. Wilkins was assigned to the case. An action, Moussazadeh v. Moussazadeh, Index No. 603797/2005, was also commenced. Although the RJI for the latter case was marked to indicate that the nature of the case was "Commercial - Corporate," the case was assigned to Justice Wilkins. The reason for this assignment, made clear in a comment in the court's computer, was that the latter case was related to the former, and indeed the RJI was so marked. The court staff does not evaluate related-case markings but simply assigns the case in accordance with those markings. Justice Wilkins is assigned to a Trial Part and does not carry an inventory beyond special proceedings. Furthermore, the parties have requested a transfer of both matters to the Commercial Division and Justice Wilkins has acceded to that request, subject to the approval of the undersigned as required by the *Guidelines*. The action is a commercial matter involving sums in excess of the Commercial Division threshold and thus belongs in the Division. The dissolution proceeding should be assigned to the same Justice. Accordingly, the Motion Support Office is directed in a separate Administrative Order to assign the action at random to a Justice of the Division and is hereby directed to assign this matter to the same Justice as a related case.
