BACKGROUND

Due to changes in the computer program servicing Housing Part matters it has become necessary that we now <u>require</u> that the bar and the public comply precisely with the mandate of CPLR 2101(d) which states:

Indorsement by attorney. Each paper served or filed shall be indorsed with the name, address and telephone number of the attorney for the party serving or filing the paper, or if the party does not appear by attorney, with the name, address and telephone number of the party.

DIRECTIVE OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE

Because of the revised requirements of the Housing Part Computer, the following specifics are now <u>mandatory</u>:

Name	Be specific, use first name, not initials.
Address	Provide street address for personal service
	of papers, rather than P.O. Box number.
City, State and Zip Code	Zip Code is necessary for our computer
	program.
Telephone Number	This is also required for our computer
	program.

This information must be provided at the time the Petition is submitted to the Housing Part Clerk/Cashier for filing. Any Petition which does not contain this information will be rejected by the Clerk/Cashier.

CLERKS PROCEDURES, Landlord & Tenant Cashier

Following the directive of the Administrative Judge, the Housing Part Clerk/Cashier is to review each Petition submitted to look for the presence of the following information.

Name Address City, State and <u>Zip Code</u> and Telephone Number

of either the Petitioner or of the Attorney representing the Petitioner.

The Clerk/Cashier is to check to see that this information is provided.

If the Name, Street Address, Zip Code and/or Telephone Number is not provided, the Clerk/Cashier is to <u>reject</u>, and return any Petition which does not contain at least the minimal information required to the person submitting it.
