MAYOR'S COMMITTEE ON THE JUDICIARY

(Amending Executive Order No. 10 [1978])


By the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of New York, it is hereby ordered:

Section 1. Prior Order Amended. Paragraph (a) of Section 5 of Executive Order Number 10 (1978), as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"§5. Committee Membership.

(a) The Committee shall consist of twenty-seven members, each residing or having principal place of business in the City of New York, all of whom shall be appointed by the Mayor. The Mayor shall select the Chairperson who shall serve at his pleasure. The Presiding Justices of the Appellate Division for the First and Second Judicial Departments shall each nominate six members for appointment to the Committee by the Mayor. Two deans of law schools within the City of New York shall each nominate one member for appointment to the Committee by the Mayor, with authority to nominate rotating annually among eligible deans. If the Mayor decides not to appoint any person nominated by a Presiding Justice or dean, he shall notify the Presiding Justice or dean who made the nomination to submit the name of another nominee. Those members chosen by law school deans shall serve for a term of one year commencing January 1, 1986. The other Committee members shall serve for terms of two years; provided however, that for the term commencing January 1, 1986, the Mayor shall designate half of the members he selected to serve for terms of one year and the Presiding Justices shall each designate three of their six nominees to serve for terms of one year. Vacancies in the Committee shall be filled in the same manner as initial appointments, and persons appointed to fill vacancies shall serve for the remainder of the term. A member of the Committee may be removed by the Mayor for cause.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Order shall take effect immediately.
